Clubs, charitable, religious and other nonprofit organizations may sell beer or liquor at an event with a temporary license approved by the council. The fire department's Rose Fest beer garden is an example. Requests must reach City Hall by the first of the month before the council meeting that precedes the event.

Fee: Temporary 3.2 beer \$45 per day. Temporary on-sale intoxicating liquor (nonprofits, up to four days) has no city fee beyond the state's; council approval is required. Depot Park alcohol permits are a separate council consent-agenda item.
